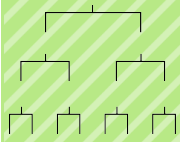

# Weir Room Discovery Guide

## Getting Started with Family History

- > Utilize Pedigree Charts and Family Group Sheets to keep information organized. These helpful worksheets can be found online.
- > Preserve notes in a notebook and/or in Word or Google Docs. Back up everything as you work digitally.
- > Write down and keep lists of all surname spellings and variations.
- > Talk to relatives, beginning with the oldest. Be sure to take written notes or record your interviews. Ask for dates and milestones, Bible records, and if family histories or ancestors' photographs exist.
- > Document family birth, marriage, death, and burial records (vital records) in your Pedigree Chart and Family Group Sheet.
- > Document your findings so you will know the exact sources later.
- > Get to know your local library, reference librarian, and especially its collections and digital resources for genealogy research.
- > Don't forget to network! Join a local genealogy and/or historical society.
- > Learn how to search the large primary databases—Ancestry, Family Search, and MyHeritage—and get to know their resources.

## Getting Started in the Weir Room

- > Use the library's website to guide your discovery process - [www.butlerlibrary.info/genealogy](http://www.butlerlibrary.info/genealogy)
- > Search the library catalog by entering a surname + the word "family"
- > Search the library's Newspaper Index for local obits which may be accessed in the microfilm collection.
- > Search the other indexes on the library's website: Servicemen, Poor Farm & Photo indexes. These indexes are in PDF format using alphabetical listings by surname.
- > Use the Weir Room (floorplan) Map to locate items in the room. Maps are available at the Information Services Desk & at the the Weir Room entrance.
- > Connect with Ancestry Library Edition, MyHeritage Library Edition, or Family Search from within the library for access to many records & genealogy resources. With a library card or a photo ID, you may use a public computer in the computer lab. Ask a librarian about using a laptop in the Weir Room. Photo ID is required for a laptop.
- > Schedule a one-on-one session for an orientation to the Weir Room collections and library resources. To schedule an appointment, talk to a librarian at the Information Services/Reference desk.

## When You Need Research Help

**When you hit a brick wall or just can't do the research yourself, it may be worthwhile to consider hiring a professional genealogist.
